Heart Health

Why experts say a good mood can lead to good health | American Heart Association.

It doesn't take a scientist to understand that laughter feels good, while anger feels awful. But it does take one to explain why one of these feelings can boost the immune system, while the other can wear it down, damage the heart and increase the risk for dementia. Simply put: "Mood can influence your health," said Dr. Erin Michos, director of Women's Cardiovascular Health at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore. Negative emotions – including anger, hostility and pessimism – are linked to a higher risk of heart disease and lower chance of recovery from events such as heart attacks, as well as poorer cognitive health. Conversely, a growing body of research shows feelings such as happiness, optimism, gratitude, a sense of purpose, well-being or satisfaction in life lead to better heart and brain health.

International Condom Day- February 13th 2023

- Chisago County Public Health offers free male and female condoms!
- Condoms are practical, easy to carry, and are the most affordable way to prevent HIV, other sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and unplanned pregnancies.
- Check the expiration date! Expired condoms can break easily and cause accidents. It's better to be safe than safe sorry, so make sure to only use condoms within the expiration date.
- The rates of STI's remains at near historically high levels in Minnesota, with increases in reported cases of chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis. Many STI's have no signs and symptoms, and sometimes the symptoms go away but the STI is still present. If left untreated, STI's can lead to complications such as infertility in men and women, pregnancy complications and pelvic inflammatory disease in women.
